- 1,594,748 Maryland women work, making up 49 percent of the state workforce.
- 69,510 Marylanders gave birth between 2013 and 2014.
- 972,717 Maryland children (76 percent) live in families where all parents work.
- 144,589 Maryland grandparents live with grandchildren who are under 18.
- 771,000 Marylanders serve as family caregivers.

Sexual Assault in Maryland

- An estimated 466,000 Maryland women have experienced rape in their lifetime, or 20.5% of the female population in the state.
- Maryland women have the 3rd highest lifetime prevalence of sexual violence other than rape, totaling an estimated number of 1,248,000 women, about 54.9% of the female population in the state.
- Maryland women have the 6th highest lifetime prevalence of rape, physical violence, and/or stalking by an intimate partner in the country, totaling an estimated number of 957,000 women, about 42% of the female population in the state.

Maryland Women & Poverty

- 594,000 Marylanders (10%) live in poverty, a number greater than the population of Maryland's eleven smallest counties combined. (p16)
- Single-parent households headed by a female had a poverty rate of 29.1 percent in Maryland, versus just 7.9 percent of all Maryland families. (p17)
- The annual cost of childcare in Maryland can exceed the cost of sending a child to college.
 (p25)
- The Maryland Family Network's Child Care Demographics 2013 report estimated that 79 percent of the state's children under 12 years old had mothers in the workforce, and the cost of childcare for one infant and one preschooler in most parts of the state exceeded \$1,000 a month. (p25)
- Between 2010 and 2012, 10.3 percent of Maryland residents roughly 612,000 individuals were without health insurance. (p32)

Domestic Violence in Maryland

CRIME RATE: In 2014 27,242 Marylanders (including family members) were victims of domestic violence-related crimes; of these, 19,535 were intimate partners: 69% were women and 31% were men.

DEATHS: Between 7/1/14 and 6/30/15, 25 women, 2 children, and 7 men in Maryland died as a result of domestic violence; 6 men committed suicide after actual or attempted murder, 1 man was killed by police, and 1 man was killed by his girlfriend in self-defense.
