With this adjustment, if a child exits from foster care to reunification after a placement setting of a THV, any time in that THV that exceeds 30 days does not count toward his length of stay (LOS) in foster care. For example, if a child exited to reunification after being federal indicator from 13 months (actual) to 11 months (adjusted, i.e., 13 months - 60 days), which means he gets credit for exiting to permanency within 12 months. in custody for 13 months, but his last 3 months (90 days) in custody were spent on a THV, only 30 of those 90 days count toward his LOS.
